## Trends for 2023

- Approx. 64,000 lane miles managed by Local Agencies captured in this survey.
- Representing **95%** of Local Agency asphalt paved roads statewide.
- **Over \$402M** budgeted for Annual Street Improvement Programs.
- **Over \$353M** budgeted for Capital Improvement Programs.
- Mill & Overlay program funding is flat vs. 2022.
- Maintenance programs increased funding levels 25% vs. 2022.
- Funding \$ / lane mile increased
  +10% from \$5,838 in 2022.
