Trends for 2024

- Approx. **66,000 lane miles** managed by Local Agencies captured in this survey.
- Representing **98%** of Local Agency asphalt paved roads statewide.
- **Over \$4358M** budgeted for Annual Street Improvement Programs.
- **Over \$296M** budgeted for Capital Improvement Programs.
- Mill & Overlay program funding is flat vs. 2023.
- **\$755M** Overall Agency infrastructure spending for 2024 (\$758M in 2023).
- Funding \$ / lane mile increased **+8%** from \$6,544 in 2023.
